Rural Pathways Project Overview

This is a three-year project (starting in February 2025) with a national cohort of 28 rural community colleges who will work with each other — and with community partners in their regions — to implement pathways to economic prosperity. The goals of the project are to support participating colleges as they:

- 1. Design and implement a better student experience at their colleges.
- 2. Collaborate with key local stakeholders to increase economic opportunity and partner on a cross-sector approach to implement guided pathways.
- 3. Adopt evidence-based reforms that will address inequities and lead to improved educational and workforce outcomes.

Institutes

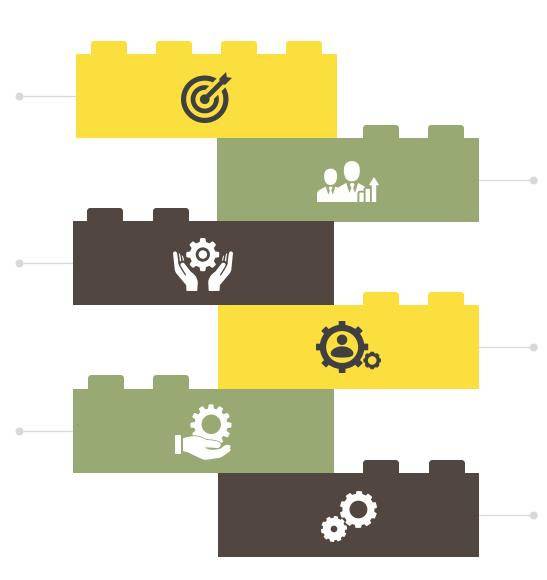
Six 2 ½ day institutes. Participating colleges will send an 8-person team to each institute.

Leadership Curriculum

College senior teams will participate in six workshops (2 in-person & 4 virtual) led by Aspen on key capacities.

Virtual Consultancies

Each college team will be invited to two virtual consultancies during the project.



Coaches

Colleges will have an assigned implementation coach & leadership coach.

Site Visits & Office Hours

Colleges will have one site visit from its implementation coach per year and two virtual office hours per semester

Topical Webinars

NCII and its partners will develop and host throughout the project.

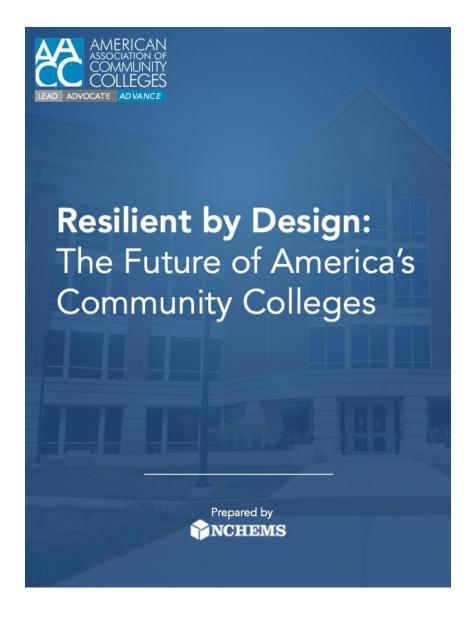

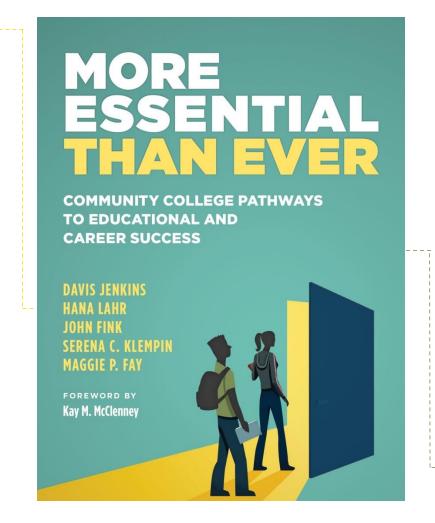
NCII will lead five 1-hour sessions on the key book chapters with an overview and breakout discussions.

Supporting Communications Efforts on Campus



Communications Community of Practice



Activities

Participants will meet virtually each month to learn about comms strategy and practice, develop comms plans, and discuss implementation.

Timeline

Participating colleges commit to being part of a Communications Community of Practice for a six-month period.

Outcomes

Comms leads will participate in six 90-minute sessions and have work between the sessions to develop plans and materials to support their colleges project goals.

Audience

Colleges will identify one person to participate. Ideally this will be college communications lead.



NEXT STEPS

- NCII will follow-up this week to gauge college interest in participating.
- Depending on the level of interest, we may run multiple groups of college comms leads.
- The first group will begin in November 2025 and run thru April 2026. A subsequent group (if needed) will start in May 2026 and run thru October 2026

Goal

Colleges focused on developing communications practices that support their college's project goals.
